Priority Area – Trailblazer Development

Customer Service Level 2 and Level 3

Customer service apprenticeships can be utilised within the NHS for any customer/patient facing roles within your organisation. These have been traditionally applied in areas such as reception, security, portering, and volunteering. With the recent changes to whom can undertake an apprenticeship, the customer service apprenticeship job standards could now be used in any role, including registered roles, which has patient facing responsibilities in order to fulfil our MECC aspirations.

The level 2 Customer Service practitioner is ready for delivery and you can find the standard and assessment plan here.

In Other News...

Medical Secretary/Medical Associate/Medical Assistant

An employer stakeholder meeting was held in London at Skills for Health to discuss the viability of proceeding with an expression of interest for a job standard for an administration role with both discreet healthcare and leadership responsibilities i.e. medical secretary or medical assistant or medical associate role.

Medical Associate or Medical Assistant role is one which is intended to be utilised in primary care (GP surgeries) and will be one which will support the GP in administration duties but could potentially also be a career pathway to practice manager. In Trusts this role may be called a medical secretary which would support the medic and/or multidisciplinary team, once again potentially having some supervisory responsibilities for other administration staff.

Please find attached the presentation given at this initial stakeholder group and the minutes of the meeting.

There is only a small number of employers represented in the West Midlands, and more specifically requires increase representation from Trust. **Could you please approach your senior administration staff** to see if they are interested in joining this potential trailblazer to assist in the development of this job standard?
