Attention Psychology LeadsPsychological Wellbeing Practitioner Apprenticeship

An employer stakeholder group has been established to develop an expression of interest to develop an apprenticeship job standard for a Psychological Wellbeing Practitioner. The stakeholder group lead by South Essex Partnership Trust and supported by Health Education England are holding a development workshop on 8th February 2017 in London.

The purpose of this workshop is to offer an overview of the work to be undertaken to establish the national apprenticeship standards for the PWP role within adult IAPT services. At the end of the workshop we will need to:

- Have agreed the core components of the Expression of Interest ready for submission to the Trailblazers at the end of February
- Have established commitment to the programme of work by at least 10 service providers
- Have established commitment to the programme by at least 2 HEIs
- Have common understanding of what we are planning and the enablers and constrictions we may encounter
- Have sign up to the work streams from interested parties
- Have some key milestones and dates set for the programme

Registering and reporting on the DAS

Queries have been recently raised by levy paying employers regarding registering on the Digital Apprenticeship Service (DAS); including how and when.

Registration on the DAS will be phased roll-out with each employer being notified when they are able to register.

Business Administration / Medical Administrator / GP Assistant

Skills for Health have recently been commissioned by Health Education England to scope the appetite for the development of job standard/s around the medical administration / GP Assistant and Business Administration roles. Please find below a copy of the final report. **Please disseminate to Administration leads within your Trust.**



The report suggests stakeholders have feedback that a Level 2 Business Administrator apprenticeship standard is needed within the health sector and Skills for Health with Health Education England are keen to create a 'sub group' of the existing Level 3 Trailblazer group to take this forward. They are therefore inviting you or a colleague to join the employer led group to develop this standard. The process is on average about 12 months with some face-to-face meetings, teleconference and correspondence over email. Technical Education Reforms – latest news on panel of professional recruitment

In response to the recommendations from the Independent Panel on Technical Education, the government has proposed organising technical education into 15 routes (see below)



221 Trailblazer groups – developed standards and assessment plans

For each route of the new technical education, the DfE will be recruiting panels of professionals (with direct experience in these occupations) (previously known as 'employer panels'). These panels would be responsible for developing standards for specific occupations and providing advice and recommendations on wider qualification content.

1. Apprenticeship Changes

2. Procurement

The Crown Commercial Service recently published guidance relating to the 'light touch regime' which applies to apprenticeships. The Skills Funding Agency recent procurement process of approving Training Providers (known as Register of Approved Training Providers – RoATP) is compliant with the CCS Light Touch Regime. It has been advised to liaise with your commercial/ procurement internal specialist. The publication can be found at: - CCS Light Touch Procurement

3. HMRC Levy Collection

The calculation, collection and levy charge guidance is the responsibility of HMRC. 'My Account Managers' are not tax experts and are therefore unable to offer any technical advice, and you are encouraged to work with your PAYE/ finance colleagues who already have a relationship with HMRC.
