Happy New Year!! Welcome to our first edition of 'Grow Your Potential' Newsletter. We are the Workforce, Planning and Assurance Team from South Staffordshire and Shropshire Healthcare NHS Foundation Trust (SSSFT). SSSFT provides healthcare in mental health, learning disabilities and specialist children's care. The Trust covers a wide geographical area, including services in Staffordshire, Shropshire, Telford and Wrekin and also provides services in prisons as far as the Isle of Wight and Liverpool.

The Workforce Planning and Assurance Team are a small, yet diverse team of four who provide a variety of services across our Trust. Our services include the Apprenticeship and Career Development Programmes, the Work Experience Programme, Workforce Information and Assurance reporting, support teams across the Trust, Workforce Planning, Workforce Structures and Service Redesign. We attend regular career conventions to promote the NHS as a career choice and promote apprenticeships and work experience opportunities. One of our key objectives is to work closely with Careers Advisors, Schools, Parents and Pupils to show them the variety of roles that are available in our own Trust and the NHS as a whole. We want to open your eyes to what NHS career opportunities there are waiting to unfurl.

Apprenticeships at SSSFT

What is an Apprenticeship?

Apprenticeships are work-based training programmes available to anyone from the age of 16 to 65. They enable learners to demonstrate their competence while gaining a recognised qualification, achieved through a mix of on the job training and study, whilst at the same time earning a wage.

There are a range of apprenticeship levels that lead to different qualifications, and they typically take between one and four years to complete. Apprenticeships bring a number of tangible benefits to NHS organisations, including creating skilled and motivated employees.

Apprentices train for a specific job, and this usually means they are committed to that role. They have made an active choice to learn within a work setting.
